GP Fellowship opportunity

The Phoenix Programme offers advice on employment and career development for GPs across Nottingham and Nottinghamshire. We provide a range of support including running a variety of GP workforce schemes starting in GP training through to later career. We work collaboratively with colleagues across the ICS in addressing workforce issues.

We are now looking to appoint an International Medical Graduate (IMG) GP fellow as part of our New to Practice GP fellowship team.

The New to Practice GP fellowship is a national scheme funded by NHSE: https://www.england.nhs.uk/wp-content/uploads/2020/08/general-practice-fellowship-2021-22-operational-guidance.pdf.

An increasing proportion of our local GPs in training are IMG colleagues and we are keen to ensure that their experience of starting work as a newly qualified GP in Nottinghamshire is as supported as possible. We recognise that there are specific challenges faced by IMG colleagues including finding a job in a practice who can sponsor skilled workers and potentially the lack of an established, local supportive network. We are therefore looking to expand our New to Practice team to recruit a GP fellow to specifically focus on the needs of IMG colleagues and how these can best be addressed. We want all newly qualified GPs to feel welcomed, valued and supported as they start their career in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire, so that all of our GP workforce can thrive in work and reach their potential.

Role:

- GP fellow
- One session per week @ £9000 per session per year
- Associate 12 month contract (self-employed)

Responsibilities and Development opportunities:

Under the guidance of the leadership team within the Phoenix Programme you will:

- Identify existing support for IMG colleagues (local and national), including a review of the recent national IMG induction programme and how this can be signposted and implemented in primary care locally
- Network and engage with colleagues locally and nationally engaged in IMG support development
- Explore gaps in support for early career IMGs joining primary care and how these might be addressed
- Develop resources, based on identified needs, to best support newly qualified IMGs
- Review our existing New to Practice GP Fellowship to ensure maximal benefit
 and inclusion for IMG colleagues locally within the primary care system and
 as part of a peer group of early career GP colleagues
- Explore local capacity for employers to recruit and support colleagues on skilled worker visas and methods to increase capacity if required
