Portfolio Working/Teaching Opportunity

The Phoenix Programme offers advice on employment and career development for GPs across Nottinghamshire. We provide a range of support including running a variety of GP workforce schemes starting in GP training through to later career.

We are now looking to appoint 2-3 new tutors for our Trainee Transition Scheme.

The Trainee Transition Scheme offers interactive small group teaching sessions to GP trainees, currently on the Nottingham GP Specialty Training Programme (GPSTP). The teaching covers a wide range of topics to compliment the traditional GP training curriculum, to aim to prepare our colleagues for life beyond training. This is an innovative scheme that may expand into other GPSTPs in the future. The Trainee Transition Scheme and its benefits have recently been presented at national conference level at the RCGP AGM conference in October 2021 and has also been featured in an article for GP Online.

These posts would particularly suit early career GPs with an interest in medical education.

Trainee Transition Scheme Tutor

Role:

- GP educator to facilitate locality group teaching sessions for GP trainees
- Equivalent of half a session per week @ £9000 per session per year pro-rata, total £4500 per annum
- Associate contract (self-employed)

Responsibilities and Development opportunities:

Under the guidance of the Early Career Development Lead you will:

- Deliver 3 small group teaching sessions per term to GP trainees on Wednesday afternoons (9 sessions per year) N.B. These are currently being delivered virtually, although may return to face to face in the future
- Co-write 1 small group teaching session per term for GP trainees with another tutor (3 sessions per year)
- Act as a point of contact for GP trainees in your locality group and signposting colleagues to opportunities and support available via the Phoenix Programme for GPs in Nottinghamshire
- Develop as a medical educator through experience of planning, writing and delivering teaching materials with opportunities for supportive peer review and feedback
